RECTOR'S CORNER

"The Living Church" is an independent weekly publication for people in the Episcopal Church. We keep a stack of them in the parish house living room. A recent article on church growth caught my attention because of the many thoughtful offerings made by various people around the United States. It began with what I call a hook: There's an old Episcopal Church adage about growth, "You can't walk to the ocean's edge with an aquarium full of water, and expect the fish to jump in."

I like that quip because of its light-hearted humor and transparent meaning. People, like fish, need an obvious and compelling reason to jump from one set of circumstances into another. It is not easy to walk into a strange new church full of unfamiliar people who worship with a 1,001-page prayer book and two hymnals. Most people find a warm welcome and a growing network of relationships helps.

My favorite comment came from the rector of Trinity Episcopal Church, Fayetteville, N.Y. and had nothing to do with growth. "You should not be interested in growth. Focus instead on good relationships; trusting relationships. Work on quality and depth, and increased spiritual presence. Growth will follow."

I think that involvement in small group ministry is one way to increase good relationships, trusting relationships, and spiritual presence. We have tried over the years at Piedmont Church to foster the formation of a diversity of small groups within our congregation. In each of those ministry groups we encourage a sense of support and prayerful engagement with peoples' struggles. These prayers may be an inherent part of the group activities or they may be tacked on to a vestry meeting or choir rehearsal in the form of asking for peoples' joys and concerns, and then praying for them.

We currently have seven small group ministries of 6 to 14 people who meet regularly for the sole purpose of study, prayer and mutual support. These groups are open to every member of the church and community, and they meet at a variety of days and times for people with busy schedules. The newest group is the parents of Sunday school children and J2A youth. They meet for coffee, mutual support, and occasional topical study at 9:00 a.m. in the living room of the parish house.

Most of these groups do not require much preparation other than a willingness to get to know each other better and to share the joy of living with the occasional struggle that we all experience. Check the church calendar or ask around on Sunday morning! Other groups like Sunday school teachers, choir, altar guild or the gardeners are always thrilled to have new people and helping hands. There's a time, a place, and an activity for everyone.

TREASURER S NOTES

The following are assorted pieces of information for the congregation related to the Treasurer s activities and procedures. They are intended to be informational in nature.

Checks placed in the tithing plate are assumed to be either pledge contributions or general donations UNLESS otherwise noted in the bottom left hand corner of your checks note field. To say this in another way, it is not necessary to make a note on your check if it is for a pledge payment or a general donation.

It is not a good idea to split a donation on a single check. For example, to specify part of the check as a pledge and part as an outreach payment. Odds are high that the payment will not be properly recorded. Please write two checks for payments for different purposes.

Payments for special fund raising such as UTO and African Team Ministries should be made out to Piedmont Episcopal Church with the purpose of the donation noted in the bottom left hand corner of your check. If your check is made out to some other specific organization (such as UTO), that check will not appear on your quarterly statement since the check was not made out to Piedmont and the bank cannot legally deposit such a check to the Church s account. Checks made out to other organizations make our book keeping much more complicated and they will not appear on your statements.

Standard Piedmont Church procedure is to have the Vestry person on duty each Sunday record all checks collected on any given Sunday. It is their responsibility to record if any given check was specified for any purpose other than a pledge payment or general donation. Your Treasurer s do not see your individual checks.

Beppy White generates quarterly statements for each pledging family based on information provided by the aforementioned Vestry input. There are sometimes omissions of information or transcription errors. Please check your quarterly statements to verify your donations were correctly allocated. If there is a discrepancy you wish to correct, please contact Beppy.

Cash (as opposed to checks) placed in the Tithing plate cannot be assigned to an individual unless it is placed in a contribution envelope. There is a monthly schedule on how such loose contributions are allocated. The loose cash collected on the first Sunday of each month is allocated into Brad s Discretionary account. The loose cash

collected on the fourth (or Outreach) Sunday of each month is allocated for the identified Outreach program. The loose cash collected on all other Sundays of each month is allocated into the general budget as a donation.

There are Church related expense reimbursement forms in the Treasurer's box (in the kitchen basement of the Church). Please use one of these forms if you wish to be reimbursed for an expense and include the expense receipts (or a copy) if at all possible.

Please notify the Treasurer of any significant pending expense to assure that monies are available for that expense.

Remember that we are a tax free organization. We have forms available to present to retailers to register us as a tax free organization. This should be considered for any repetitive purchases or any significant expense to avoid a sales tax payment. We have such a form registered at Food Lion.

There is a locked wooden box in the kitchen of the Parish House to be used for donations to offset the expense of the Day by Day booklets. This box may be used for other donations but be aware that this box is checked infrequently (like every few weeks).

Your Treasurers try to provide newsletter budget updates quarterly and other information as appropriate. If there are other Treasurer related topics you would like discussed, please contact Roger or Beppy.

NEWSLETTER

We continue the process of providing an alternate method for distribution of the Church Newsletter, specifically via email. Many members of the congregation have agreed to distribution of the newsletter via this method and we will be able to save significantly on distribution costs and labor (and paper).
