Minister's Musings

40 Days

In case you haven't yet looked at this week's church calendar, there is a LOT on it. Four out of seven days provide opportunities to gather for both celebration and prayer. Most weeks we see each other half that often. Perhaps it feels like far too much peopling for you, too much church, or too much scheduling to want to participate. It might be. Or it might be the perfect way to enter the upcoming Lenten season, focused and intentionally looking ahead to the cross and Easter morning.

Since the earliest days, Christians have purposed to fast (refrain from food) during the days approaching Easter. Eventually the fasting, became associated with the forty days Jesus spent in the wilderness. The forty-days were significant for new believers who were making their preparation for baptism. According to The Episcopal Church, "the forty days of Lent extend from Ash Wednesday through Holy Saturday, omitting Sundays. The last three days of Lent are the sacred Triduum of Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday. Today Lent has reacquired its significance as the final preparation of adult candidates for baptism. Joining with them, all Christians are invited 'to the observance of a holy Lent, by self-examination and repentance; by prayer, fasting, and self-denial; and by reading and meditating on God's holy Word' (BCP, p. 265)."

We, in today's Western World, most of us take very few things as seriously as our forebearers approached their religious observances. There is both benefit and danger to scrupulosity and an over-attachment to religious practice. Merely doing more things does not accomplish God's will for us. God desires our hearts and our attention because God knows that it is through that relationship we are equipped to live the life we were created and called to live.

My goal for our worshiping communities to gather, fellowship, and pray at the beginning of Lent is to start our Lenten season off in a way that positions us best for lifechanging encounters with God. We may not all want our lives changed. Some of us might prefer if our lives did NOT change. But I believe God is always inviting us closer. It was the disciple's closeness with Jesus that changed the world.

May we be a people so compelled by our faith, that we position ourselves to hear The Spirit's call, and strengthen ourselves in God's presence to follow that call. May we be a people whose experiences of God change the world.



Shrine Mont's Centennial


