### **Baptismal Identity**

This Sunday we celebrate the feast of The Baptism of our Lord. Most Episcopalians were baptized as babies, so for people in small churches that don't have multiple baptismal services each year, the concept of baptism isn't one that comes up much. But baptism is not just about a one-time event. It is a foundational sacrament, from which everything we do in the church flows, and I think we should highlight it more! According to The Book of Common Prayer, "Holy Baptism is full initiation by water and the Holy Spirit into Christ's Body the Church". Baptism is our entrance into communion with Christ, fellowship with the Spirit, and participation with one another. Our world doesn't spend much time focusing on rituals, but this one is an outward symbol of our internal transformation. It is a BIG deal!

The baptismal service asks people to affirm certain things. Babies, who cannot make their own affirmations, have their families and presenters affirm their participation in raising the child according to these beliefs and intentions. While we agree to these things at baptism, they shape our lives in an ongoing way. We renounce Satan, sin, and evil. We place our trust and obedience in God. We proclaim, yes even Episcopalians, PROCLAIM by word and example the Good News of God in Christ. And my favorite affirmations are that we "seek and serve Christ in all persons" and "strive for justice and peace among all people and respect the dignity of every human being".

These values are the things that shape our lives personally and corporately. The BCP also says, "the bond which God establishes in Baptism is indissoluble", illustrated in the liturgical words "you are sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and marked as Christ's own forever". Approaching each day with the awareness of the unbreakable bond we have with God ought to shape our motivations and empower our love for the world!

The prayer after Baptism is beautifully inspiring and I pray it for us all. It asks God to give us "an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works". May it be so among us!

To help us remember our baptismal identity, some churches practice "asperges". This is where a priest uses straw dipped in water to sprinkle congregants during the liturgy. I feel like the rubrics would support the use of a squirt gun. With an impassioned deacon on the loose, you may want to start wearing rain jackets on Sundays. Baptismal waters are inspiring!

### **Creation Care**

Happy Epiphany!

You will probably remember the 3 Epiphanies celebrated by the Church over the centuries, and recognized by our denomination: the coming of the Magi, the Baptism of Christ, and the Wedding at Cana where He miraculously changed water into wine, all manifestations of the divinity of Christ Jesus. Important, vastly important for our faith as Christians, but for me the recognition that Christ's love that came down at Christmas was, and is for all, all the world, recognized by the arrival of the Magi, is also vitally important.

I believe that is what we are called to do, to show Christ's Love out for all the world. Is it easy? I think not. Presumably the Magi traveled at night through unfamiliar and dangerous territory. With Creation Care, we may be called to do the same thing, but Devastation is not the end for us who are Resurrection people.

We are called, I believe, to not linger at the seat of power or money, Herod's own; the Magi failed to return that way. We are called to follow the Dream that God gives us, just as they did.

Epiphany is about a journey, our journey to spread the Good News of Christ in the world, Emmanuel.

Madeleine L'engle in talking about her own experience says,


"Bereavement is not the truncation of...love, but one of its regular phases."
