Minister's Musings

Trinitarian Tango

There is a trope in clergy circles that says priests should always ask their postulant to preach on Trinity Sunday because it is very difficult to speak for long about The Trinity without saying something heretical. If the postulant misspeaks, then at least the priest can save face. The reality of such theological complexity may lead lay people to fear seeking greater clarity, as if a true understanding is too far off. However, as complicated as the theological nuances regarding The Trinity are, the truth of it is in fact quite simple. The Trinity is merely another name for God.

Personally, the trinity is one of my favorite things about Christianity! In fact, there was a time when trinitarian theology was the only thing keeping me in the church. (Don't ask me about it unless you have a lot of time, because...did I mention it is one of my favorite topics?) We humans are funny creatures. We want to name and categorize everything, as if naming a thing means we understand it. Personally, I appreciate Richard Rohr's take on this in his wonderful book, *The Divine Dance*. He says "all religious language is metaphor.... We're like blind people touching the side of an elephant, describing the tiny portion we feel with all the conviction we can muster". To fully appreciate the Trinity, we must be willing to embrace mystery.

In the 39 articles, the Reformers outlined for us the basis of our trinitarian understanding by saying, "there is but one living and true God and in the unity of this godhead there be three persons, of one substance, power, and eternity; the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost". As long as we seek to comprehend this by mental gymnastics alone, we might be stymied. But once we realize that God's essence is and always has been relational, our hearts can begin to assent. God is not singular. Elohim, the Hebrew name for God, is plural. God's exists in relationship and God puts godself into creation, breathing ongoing, vital life in and through all of it.

According to Richard Norris, "Christians do not 'worship' the Trinity in the sense that they stand off from it and gawk reverently from a safe distance. On the contrary, their worship is a kind of participation in the relations among the members of the Trinity". Our life and our worship IS participation in this "divine dance". Understanding it is not the goal; partnership in the life of God is. Which is why broken relationships and human division are so problematic. Sin is anything that separates us from God and one another. Division is destructive to the fabric of our origin, the very image of God, and God's ability to perform God's work of healing on this earth. However any of us may feel about the theological framework of trinitarian theology, my greatest prayer is that our hearts embrace our participation in the Divine life as we move ever closer to God and one another.

Vestry Report

Dear Members of Piedmont:

Piedmont's financial report for the first 4 months of 2025 is posted on the parish house bulletin board. The church income and expenses are on track for the first third of the calendar year. Thanks to the congregation for your continued generous support.

This report lists the purchase in April of a new air conditioner for the church building. While this was an unexpected expense, the vestry determined that replacement was the more practical approach than partial repair to the old unit.

Recalling the adage "when it rains, it pours" an additional building issue has come up. The parish house apartment floor sustained some water damage during the recent periods of heavy rain. Some of the flooring in the downstairs kitchen area will be replaced. The vestry is still investigating how to solve the runoff and drainage issues which will likely involve some excavation. In consultation with contractors on various options, the vestry has been advised that the deodar cedar in the front yard of the parish house is contributing to the problem. Reluctantly, the cedar tree is scheduled to be taken down on Friday, June 6. While this is a loss to our beautiful property, Piedmont's cost is limited to debris removal. The expense of taking it down will be borne by REC as their electric lines and pole are engulfed by the tree.

Please know that vestry members are available to answer questions about these projects. The next vestry meeting is June 15.

> Conference Fee- \$30 Breakfast- \$14 Lunch- \$17 Dinner- \$19




