#### **Lenten Confessions**

You may not know this, but The Episcopal Church offers an Anglican rite of confession called The Reconciliation of Penitents. If you are curious, it can be found in the Book of Common Prayer, beginning on page 447. Unlike in the Roman Catholic rite, the Episcopal version is not considered a sacrament, and it is not obligatory. However, many Episcopalians embrace this rite as part of their Lenten practice. #### Minister's Musings

#### **Celebrating Spring Like Flowers**

Tuesday, March 25th, was the celebration of the Feast of the Annunciation (the day Gabriel appeared to Mary, telling her she would be the mother of God). Nearly every branch of Christianity commemorates this sacred moment. Mary's response to the angel is something worth celebrating! Unlike most of the Biblical figures called by God, who responded to their callings with the resistance of buts and can'ts, Mary's response was unique. She was certainly confused, but her words indicated curiosity rather than opposition. She responded in wonderment, not aversion. And then, after Gabriel's unspecific answer to her question, "how can this be?" She replied, "may it be done to me according to your word". She didn't insist on answers or list her limitations. She was open; open to the impossible, open to change, open to hope.

In my opinion, this is the perfect feast day to celebrate spring!

Every day, for the past two weeks, I have stepped into my garden in surprise at the new life emerging. Lenten Roses, yellow daffodils, purple hyacinth, pea plants more than an inch tall now, and so many new and, as yet, unknown green stalks appearing every day. These brave plants feel the pull of Spring, the call of the sunshine, beckoning to their buried, sleeping selves. They do not know that when they pierce the top of the soil, they may encounter stinging rain, cold snow, or frozen nights. They don't worry about what exists beyond. They merely respond to the call of Spring. Like Mary, they don't argue or resist. And as a result, we all benefit from their beauty.

Unlike the Spring bulbs, we do know what exists out here in the world. The threat and loss of this place can lead many to fear and hate. All of it can make us feel so unsafe. Which is why celebrating Mary and Spring are so important! Sometimes we need to remind ourselves that this world was made by God, and it was made good. We are made of God, and we have such capacity for good. Mary said "yes" to Gabriel. She didn't allow her fear to dampen her openness. The flowers say "yes" to the pull of the sun. We too can join in the legacy of the brave who go before us with curious hearts, willing to be surprised by good, eagerly blossoming through hope. Christ was resurrected so that we too may experience the power of life and hope over despair and death. May we be willing!


# **EASTER LILIES**
