Minister's Musings

Alleluia Intermission

We have all been there. The one voice among the congregation with the accidental "alle..." before biting off the last syllable and remembering that joyful exclamation is on temporary suspension. Oops.

But why? Why do we pause the joy? In a world filled with so much pain and heartbreak, what could possibly be the benefit of losing one of our constant sources of delight? Is God mad? Has God fled? Certainly not! But as we all know, there is something powerful about periods of transition and suspension that build expectation and allow us to experience things differently. And so, Christians, like so many other religious practitioners from various faith

traditions, choose to embrace a period of restriction.

In Lent everything about the weekly liturgy shifts from joy and praise to penitence and reflection. We forgo the Gloria in favor of seeking mercy. We remove the altar flowers and veil the crosses. We limit our music and privilege the minor keys. We choose a reflective posture, stillness, and quiet. For five Sundays our congregational focus will be on the cost of sin rather than the joy of salvation. We can do this free from fear because we know Easter is coming.

We exist in a noisy world and cannot help but be influenced by its clamor. The news, social media, music, friends, and entertainment all loudly tell us what to think and how to feel. During Lent, our churches mark a stark difference in our practice to highlight The Voice that is so often unnoticed above the fray. If it feels jarring or unsettling, in contrast to the outside world, that is an invitation. We do this together, deliberately, so we can hear. We will move from here in forty days with both the joy of anticipated release and a freshly calculated sense of purpose.

If you find yourself cutting off the praise, mid-word, in the next worship service you attend, don't be embarrassed. We are all grateful to know and be reminded that the Alleluia's will soon return! But, for now, we will try to remember together the reason why we are holding ourselves back. Soon enough we will celebrate again. Thanks be to God...




