"MINISTER'S MUSINGS"

Autumn's Michaelmas

September 29th is the historic celebration of Michaelmas, the feast of Saint Michael and all Angels. In ancient times, the celebration signified the end of the harvest and entrance into the cozy days of Fall. But ironically, Saint Michael was no more interested in sipping warm cider and snuggling beside the hearth than he was an actual saint. Celestial beings cannot be canonized, but he is so deeply venerated that he acquired the title anyway. Michael is the Archangel and heavenly warrior. He is the chief angel recognized for his courage, protection of the saints, and participation in acts of divine intervention. Michael is the Leader of the Heavenly Army, the Guardian of the Church, and the one who accompanies the departed on their way to Heaven. Whether he's protecting us directly, the broader church in general, or looking after our loved ones beyond the veil, his existence is a comfort to us all. He is venerated by Christians, Jews, and Muslims alike.

We no longer live in a world that universally accepts the existence of the angelic realm or the influence of celestial beings in human affairs. But, as

Christians, we recognize that there are things we cannot understand and a God who operates in places we cannot see. Many people still pray directly to Saint Michael for help and protection. Others save their prayers for God alone, trusting the divine to help by any means possible. However we understand God to provide for our protection in this life and the next, it is my hope that through acknowledging this special day, our imaginations can be inspired by the limitlessness of the ways God's protection enfolds us.

Collect: Everlasting God, you have ordained and constituted in a wonderful order the ministries of angels and mortals: Mercifully grant that, as your holy angels always serve and worship you in heaven, so by your appointment they may help and defend us here on earth; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.


Parish House Deck Project

Most of you know that the parish house's deck, which has served us so well for many years, has finally given up the ghost. To ensure the safety of our congregants, it must be restored. The project has been budgeted to cost about \$20,000. The vestry has been able to utilize some surplus funds from our time without a priest and move some funds from the budget towards this project. While that is depleting what has been held in reserve, those reserves are intended for such a time as this. Consequently, we are currently within roughly \$5000 of our goal. Being so close to our goal has provided the ability to start the process of securing contractors. However, we still need help getting the final amount secured. The vestry would like to thank everyone who has already generously contributed to this project in both financial assistance and in prayer! Let's keep pressing towards the completion of our final goal!
